STEM IN ACTION

Our STEM program sent 14 girls in 7th and 8th grade to the Lockheed Martin Rotary & Mission Systems (RMS) Women In Engineering (WIE) Celebration last Friday. The purpose of this event is to encourage young women to explore the fields of Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) to go on to major in an STEM discipline and pursue a career in a STEM related field. Students were involved in various STEM challenges through the day, including pasta and Marshmallow Towers, Marble PVC Maze, Virtual Reality Mission to Mars, Paper Airplanes, Balloon Powered Rockets, etc. Students attended a panel of women engineers over a lunch.

Our STEM program also sent 44 students to learning about the Gates Manufacturing process with volunteer employee facilitators. Students had to take on different roles to accomplish a common goal of designing and building Mars Rovers in a competition to earn a “Nice Company” contract. The field trip was exciting, engaging and educational.
